

Part 2 of "Stood Helpless as their Floating Home was Ransacked' which is the story of how my family ended up coming to NZ and our adventures along the way, I thought some of you would be interested in reading the full story of the Voyage as written by my father John Dovey. I gave my talk at the May Club Night . Part 1 of the story was in the June edition of the MAG.

The Voyage - Written by John Dovey

I had the advantage of a very good neighbour Captain Charles Tottenham my farm had originally been part of his estate and though a fairly wealthy man he was an enthusiastic famer and breeder and particularly good with diesel engines.

I should have explained the Ros Aine was lying in Killybegs in County Donegal in the year where she was built, this is some 300 miles from Wicklow and to get her meant a passage round the Northwest coast or Ireland and down the Irish Sea, so when Charles Tottenham offered to help me bring her round I gladly accepted. The third member of our crew was Fred Murphy who was to manage the farm for the new owner. We travelled by road to Killybegs but had to wait there almost a week because of bad weather but by the 25 of June there was still a very big sea with a heavy westerly swell and the Ros Aine rolled violently to myself used to larger vessels this was something to wonder at, the roll was quick and on this occasion round the 30 angle, every sea had to be climbed over so it was literally impossible to work on deck.

I was very sick but all things pass and by dawn we were off the Belfast Lough and by the next morning were well into the Irish Sea to comparable calm.

I stayed in Wicklow until the 28 th of August fitting out, this included transforming the fish hold into a dining saloon, galley, two one berth rooms and four storerooms, of course it cost a great deal of money and time.

One day when we were lying alongside the wharf a man in a white boiled suit drove up and stopped for a chat, he turned out to be James Bonus the engineer and wireless operator of the Wicklow Lifeboat, he also did radio and television repairs in the town.

Our transmitter and receiver had never worked but under his skilled hands there were soon in first class order, he loved boats and often come out into Wicklow Bay on our trial runs. On the 28th I left for Rosslare some 40 miles away, intending to do the passage to Falmouth in Cornwall in easy stages, the next day turned out to be excellent sailing weather, so the course was set for Lands End, which we sighted at dawn the next morning the 30th

By 8pm we were anchored in St Mawes very tired of course. On board were my wife, my daughter Elizabeth aged 16, son Mark 13, and daughter Esther 9, the purpose of our visit to Falmouth was to say farewell to our eldest daughter then 18 who at that time preferred the prospect of a career in the W.R.N.S to sailing with us to New Zealand.

The Ros Aine stayed a week in St Mawes and then moved across the bay to Falmouth where we topped up our bunkers and did a little shopping. The next day the weather forecast was for a moderate N.W. wind so I decided to leave and at 10 p.m. we sailed, the crew being myself, my wife Eunice, Elizabeth and two young children plus two dogs, a cat, and a Budgerigar.

Once clear of the Lizard we began to roll heavily and of course we all felt ill, obviously it was going to take time to get used to the motion. By midnight we could see the loom of the French lights round Ishant through still 70 miles away. Eunice and I shared the wheel house while the children tried to sleep, by 8 a.m. we were off Ushant and saw the first French fishing vessels, by 1pm we were in Douarnenez.

I had always wanted to see this town since reading a very interesting book about the Atlantic fishermen based on this port. We stayed here a week, the economy of the town which is quite large is based on fish. The old Breton style of dress still survive and are often to be seen on Sunday many of the older women wear a small lace bonnet every day and the lovely tall lace headdress on a Sunday.


